

As a professional nurse with egalitarian values, I was shocked and offended when I first heard that clinician bias is a HUGE contributing factor to the morbidity and mortality rates of Black women across our country. I am concerned that many of my colleagues are having the initial response that I did FIVE years ago. 'I am NOT biased, I treat all my patients the same," and are mindlessly clicking through the state required bias training. BEFORE you click through the training take a test and reflect on your results. I have also created a fun short 'Kahoots" to demonstrate how clinician bias shows up in the clinical setting (go to "kahoot it" on your web browser and enter the code 002320919 to join the game). I will be reaching out to all the chapter leaders to discuss how we can come together as professionals and courageously approach this together Its uncomfortable and it feels awkward at first, but I know we can make a difference. LEGISLATIVE UPDATE

At the end of 2022, we shared AWHONN's 2023 Federal Legislative and Policy Agenda, which informs advocacy during AWHONN on Capitol Hill in Washington D.C., April 24-25, 2023, during this 118th Congress (2023-2024). Many from our California Executive Leadership Team and our Chapters attended. We were very excited for the opportunity to attend in person as we see the pandemic in our rear-view mirrors!

We advocated for the following three federal bills:

- Workplace Violence Prevention for Health Care and Social Service Workers Act
- Perinatal Workforce Act
- Mothers and Offspring Mortality and Morbidity Awareness (MOMMA's) Act

Monday, April 24, was a full day of briefings on the 3 bills which prepared AWHONN members to meet with members of Congress or their staff. This included training on how to advocate, talking points and a thorough briefing on meeting logistics for the next day.

Tuesday, April 25, participants had appointments with Congresspersons or their staff to advocate for these bills.

Maternal and Child Health Provisions Enacted in FY 2023 **Omnibus Appropriations Package**

The Consolidated Appropriations Act of 2023, signed into law in December 2022, contained several important maternal and child health provisions supported by the AHA. These include:

Continuous Eligibility for Children. Effective January 1, 2024 requires states to ensure that children determined eligible for Medicaid receive continuous eligibility for 12 months.

Postpartum Coverage. The legislation would permanently give states the option to provide 12 months of post-partum coverage to women. Previously states were able to exercise this coverage option, but only through 2027. Currently, 29 states and the District of Columbia have implemented this coverage extension. CHIP Extension. The legislation extends funding for the CHIP program for an additional two years to 2029.

Also, legislation funded many maternal and child health programs. **LEARN MORE** »

California legislation effective January 1, 2023, Senate Bill 1375, authored by Senate President Pro Tem Toni Atkins, supports reproductive healthcare and builds on two existing laws:

- Assembly Bill 890, which passed in 2020, and allows nurse practitioners to practice independently.
- Atkins' own AB 154, which passed in 2013 and permitted nurse practitioners to conduct first-trimester abortions under a doctor's supervision.

National AWHONN's Abortion Advocacy Resources.

We continue to strive to expand members' knowledge of the advocacy process and the legislation that impacts our patients both federally and statewide. Our role as nurse leaders is to advocate and educate, not lobby. If you have interest in this process, we would love to have you in our ranks. Each chapter has a Legislative Coordinator position. We plan to hold office hours in 2023 to support this opportunity. We would be honored to mentor you. With Appreciation,
